- Title of Incident: Ghana Armed Forces (GAF) Clamps down on unauthorized use of military accoutrements
- Scale of Incident: Low
- **♣ Date of occurrence of Incident:** Reported 27-01-2023
- Description of Incident: The Ghana Armed Forces (GAF) says it has started clamping down on the unauthorized use of military accou-trements in a bid to prevent crimes committed with their uniforms and weapons. It, therefore, warned that any ci-vilian or group found with military pattern clothing and equipment, including guns, would be "appro-priately" dealt with according to the law and its rules of engage-ment. A statement issued by GAF Director of Public Affairs, Naval Captain Michael Addo Larbi, said the exercise followed the growing menace of unauthorized use of its equipment and uniform.1
- Location of incident: Greater Accra Region
- Casualty [Male &female]: None
- Property damaged/Affected population: None
- Coping mechanism/Responses: Disclosures and investigations indicate that some miscreants have been deliberately acquiring these military pattern clothing and equipment including guns, for dia-bolical reasons, thereby escalating tension in some communities and also placing the Ghana Armed Forces in disrepute.

Incident N*02

- Title of Incident: Eight trafficked sex workers rescued, 7 repatriated to Nigeria
- Scale of Incident: Low
- Date of occurrence of Incident: Reported 25-01-2023
- Description of Incident: A total of eight girls, who were trafficked into Ghana to engage in commercial sex have been rescued, and seven of them were repatriated to Nigeria. The Ghana Police Service and the Cape Coast office of the Social Welfare Department carried out the reparation through the Inter-national Organization for Migration after identifying the families of the victims in Nigeria. The young girls, aged between 15 and 22, were trafficked into Ghana under the pretext of securing them white collar jobs to enable them to improve their standard of living. Two of the girls were rescued at Diaso, the Upper Denkyira West District capital, three at Mankessim in the Mfantseman Municipality, and three at Assin Awisen in the Assin South Municipality of the Central Region.²
- Location of incident: Central Region.
- Casualty [Male &female]: None
- Property damaged/Affected population: Eight females affected
- Coping mechanism/Responses: The Children Residential Home of the Department of Social Welfare provided shelter for the victims through-out their stay in Ghana until they were identified and sent back to their country.

- Title of Incident: Armed robbers snatch taxi from driver at Buoho
- Scale of Incident: Low
- Date of occurrence of Incident: 18-01-2023
- Description of Incident: A 57-year-old taxi driver, Akwasi Asamoah, has been robbed of his Daewoo Matiz taxi cab,

- Title of Incident: One shot dead, two others wounded by robbers
- Scale of Incident: Low
- Date of occurrence of Incident: 09-01-2023
- Description of Incident: One person was shot dead, and two others wounded when suspected robbers opened fire on them, on the Datano -Watereso road, in the Amansie South District of Ashanti, Monday January 09, 2023 evening.4
- Location of incident: Datano -Watereso road, in the Amansie South District of Ashanti
- Casualty [Male &female]: 1 dead, 2 injured.
- Property damaged/Affected population: Three persons affected
- Coping mechanism/Responses: The Datano Police Station has also confirmed the incident and appealed to the public for information about the whereabouts of the deceased's family.

- ♣ Title of Incident: Ghana Revenue Authority (GRA) intercepts 119 bags of Indian hemp
- Scale of Incident: Low
- **♣ Date of occurrence of Incident:** Reported on 06-01-2023
- Description of Incident: About 119 bags contain-ing slabs of dried substance, suspected to be Indian hemp, has been intercepted by the Customs Division of the Ghana Revenue Authority (GRA), at Dabala, in the South Tongu District of the Volta Region. The bags were being transport-ed to an unknown location when the truck broke down along the way.5
- Location of incident: Dabala, in the South Tongu District of the Volta Region.
- Casualty [Male &female]: None
- Property damaged/Affected population: None
- **Coping mechanism/Responses:** The truck had been impounded while the driver is currently in po-lice custody to assist investigations. The Acting Commissioner of the Customs Division of the GRA, Alhaji Iddrisu Iddisah Seidu, in an interview, confirmed the interception of the suspected narcotic substance, and said the exact quantity and weight of each sack or slabs would be established by the Narcotics Control Commission when they receive the bags.

- Title of Incident: Three arrested in connection with mobile money robbery at Kasoa
- Scale of Incident: Low
- Date of occurrence of Incident: Reported 005-01-2023
- Description of Incident: The police have arrested three suspects for their alleged involvement in a mobile money robbery at Kasoa, in the Awutu Senya East District of the Central Region. The suspects shot and injured the mobile money vendor during the incident. However, one of the suspects, after his arrest, complained of ill health and was

- **♣ Date of occurrence of Incident:** Reported 04-01-2023
- Description of Incident: The Ashanti Regional Police Command has interdicted two policewomen for allegedly harassing a driver and taking bribe from the victim. Assistant Superintendent of Police (ASP) Godwin Ahyiano, Head of the Command's Public Affairs Unit, in a statement described the action of the interdicted personnel as very "unprofessional". 7
- Location of incident: Asokwa, Ashanti Region
- Casualty [Male &female]: None
- Property damaged/Affected population: Two female officers
- Coping mechanism/Responses: In accordance with the Police internal disciplinary procedures, the two, after investigation would be prosecuted to serve as deterrent to others.

- Title of Incident: Four suspects arrested over robbery and murder at Wassa Agona
- ♣ Scale of Incident: Low
- **↓** Date of occurrence of Incident: 28-01-2023
- Description of Incident: Police have arrested four persons who allegedly attacked a fuel filling station, murdering a security guard on Saturday January 28, 2023, dawn at Wassa Agona in the Western Region. A report from the Police said the suspects, in the course of the robbery, also subjected the fuel attendants to severe physical abuse and made away with an unspecified amount of money together with the filling station's CCTV Digital Video Recorder (DVR) and mobile phones belonging to the victims.8
- Location of incident: Wassa Agona in the Western Region
- Casualty [Male &female]: 1 dead (male), unknown number injured.
- Property damaged/Affected population: Four persons arrested
- **Coping mechanism/Responses:** Upon receiving information concerning the robbery, Police patrol teams within the catchment area mobilized and proceeded to the scene. The Police arrested the suspects who were about fleeing the robbery scene on a motorbike.

- Title of Incident: Homicide
- **♣ Scale of Incident:** Low
- **♣ Date of occurrence of Incident:** 11-01-2023
- **♣ Description of Incident**: A 28-year-old man is alleged to have been murdered at Dominase in the Assin South District of the Central Region. The deceased has been identified as Kwaku Emmanuel. Further checks found a school bag 60 meters away from the dead body, containing three balls of kenkey, a stabilizer, and a bluetooth speaker. The items have been kept as exhibits.
- Location of incident: Dominase in the Assin South District of the Central Region
- Casualty [Male &female]: 1 male dead

- **↓** Date of occurrence of Incident: 9-01-2023
- 🖶 Description of Incident: Residents of Gomoa-Nyamenadom in the Gomoa East District of the Central Region are living in fear following the murder of a 46-year-old woman and her 28-year-old son. They were murdered at the deceased, Josephine Sarpong's residence, a popular bar owner in the area. Preliminarily investigation conducted by the police indicates that madam Sarpong, was sexually assaulted before the murder.
- Location of incident: Gomoa-Nyamenadom in the Gomoa East District of the Central Region
- Casualty [Male &female]: 1 female and 1 male dead
- Property damaged/Affected population: Two persons affected
- lacktriangle Coping mechanism/Responses: The bodies of the deceased have been deposited at a morgue pending investigations. 10

Incident N*02

- Title of Incident: Sodomy
- ♣ Scale of Incident: Low
- **♣ Date of occurrence of Incident:** 9-01-2023
- 🖶 Description of Incident: A middle-aged woman is accusing her ex-husband of sodomizing their ward. Mary Yeboah alleges her ex-husband, Kwaku Darko, sodomized their child who was a year and eight months old thrice when they were together as couple. According to the woman, the child's health started deteriorating, with regular fever and fluid oozing from the private part.
- Location of incident: Asante Akyem Agogo in the Eastern Region
- Casualty [Male &female: 1 female child injured.
- Property damaged/Affected population: A female child affected

Coping mechanism/Responses: The mother of the victim took the child to the hospital where a police report was requested. But after the police report, the man allegedly absconded. 11

- **♣ Date of occurrence of Incident:** Reported 12-01-2023
- Lescription of Incident: A day-old baby girl has been found in a public toilet at Dominibo No.2 near Bibiani in the Bibiani Anhwiaso Bekwai Municipality in the Western North Region. The baby girl was discovered by the Unit Committee Chairman, Stephen Donkor, who was a patron of the public latrine. The mother who was identified was traumatized, and has not been able to speak to or give reasons for dumping her baby in the public toilet.
- 🖶 Location of incident: Dominibo No 2 near Bibiani in the Bibiani Anhwiaso Bekwai Municipality in the Western North

- Date of occurrence of Incident: 1-01-2023
- 🖶 Description of incident: Four persons have been confirmed dead after they were involved in accident that occurred in Takoradi in the Western Region. The accident which happened in the early hours of Sunday January 1, 2023, involved two buses; a Republic of Liberia registered sprinter bus and an Assemblies of God bus. According to an eyewitness, the sprinter had overtaken many vehicles on top speed and whilst negotiating a curve at the New Apostolic Junction at Kojokrom, it collided with the bus.

- **♣ Casualty [Male &female**]: 4 dead
- 🖶 Property damaged/Affected population: Four persons affected, and two vehicles damaged

- ♣ Description of incident: Eight, who were among 20 school children, crossing the Volta Lake with a canoe on from Atigagome to the Wayokope District Assembly Primary school, around 0700 hours, have died by drowning.

- Casualty [Male &female]: 6 males and 2females dead
- **♣ Property damaged/Affected population:** Twenty persons affected

- Title of Incident: Flooding
- **Scale of Incident**: Low
- **♣ Date of occurrence of Incident:** 24-01-2023 (reported 25-01-2023)
- **◆ Description of Incident**: Heavy rainfall has destroyed many buildings at Sehwi Ahibenso in the Bodi District. The rainfall collapsed the roofs off multiple houses, with residents left stranded after the incident. The heavy wind also uprooted a tree which damaged a Kia Sportage car that was parked close to it.
- Location of incident: Sehwi Ahibenso in the Bodi District.
- ♣ Casualty [Male &female]: None
- ♣ Property damaged/Affected population: Unconfirmed number of persons with several stranded and housing properties destroyed
- **Coping mechanism/Responses**: The Assemblyman for the Ahibenso electoral area, Stephen Armah, has appealed to the Government to come to their aid as the situation is beyond their control.⁴⁷

- ≠ Title of Incident: Cough syrups kill 300 children, World Health Organization (WHO) issues another alert
- ♣ Scale of Incident : Low
- **♣** Date of occurrence of Incident: 25-01-2023
- ♣ Description of Incident: The WHO has highlighted the massive amount of presence of two highly toxic chemicals in cough syrups which are have been used for kids. The two toxic chemicals which were found in the contaminated cough syrups are diethylene glycol (DEG) and ethylene glycol (EG). These syrups has also resulted in the death of over 300 children from different countries.
- Location of incident: Internationally
- ♣ Casualty [Male &female]: 300 victims so far
- **♣ Property damaged/Affected population**: Three hundred children affected
- Coping mechanism/Responses: The World Health Organization (WHO) has issued an updated warning to all the countries.⁴⁸

- 🖶 Description of Incident: Five people have reportedly died after eating a meal of rice and beans, popularly known as waakye, they bought from a food joint at Oyibi Bush Canteen Junction, in Accra. It was alleged that the food could have been poisoned. About 40 people were reportedly affected, out of which five, including a pregnant woman and a lotto vendor, died.
- Location of incident: Oyibi Bush Canteen Junction, in Accra
- Casualty [Male &female]: 5 dead, 45 others injured
- Property damaged/Affected population: None
- 🖶 Coping mechanism/Responses: The victims were rushed to the Valley View Hospital, Oyibi Hospital, Dodowa Hospital and other facilities when they complained of severe stomach aches after they had eaten the food. ⁴⁹

- Title of Incident: Fire outbreak
- Scale of Incident : Low
- ♣ Date of occurrence of Incident: 23-01-2023
- **♣ Description of Incident**: Over 200 girls of the Wa Senior High Technical School (SHTS) have been left stranded following a fire outbreak that razed portions of the main girls' dormitory block at the school. The fire started at about 8:00 pm at night, destroying five rooms and the belongings of the girls in the one-storey dormitory block. There are no human casualties
- **Location of incident:** Wa in the Upper West Region
- Casualty [Male &female]: None
- ♣ Property damaged/Affected population: Unconfirmed number of Girls affected with five dormitories and several learning materials and cloths destroyed.
- 🖶 Coping mechanism/Responses: The Ghana National Fire Service were called in to quench the fire., some of the girls were shocked and traumatized and have been sent to the nearest health facility.⁵⁰

Residents who had observed her for a long time decided to keep a close eye on her out of curiosity to unravel what she uses the blended ingredients for, they discovered that the suspect has been selling the waste products as shito to members of the public at a popular kenkey joint in Koforidua.
- Location of incident: Koforidua in the Eastern Region
- Casualty [Male &female]: None
- Property damaged/Affected population: None
- 🖶 Coping mechanism/Responses: The suspect was arrested and handed over to the Koforidua Central Police where she is assisting with investigations.⁵¹

The victims were part of a team who were fighting afire outbreak involving a single dual-use structure containing two rooms used for dwelling and electronic service workshop at East Tanokrom in Takoradi. The fire, which cause is yet to be established, destroyed the rooms and the contents thereof.

- Location of incident: Kwadaso-Siloam community in the Ashanti Region

- **Property damaged/Affected population:** Several properties destroyed
- **♣ Coping mechanism/Responses:** The security service ensured ensured calm in the community as the fire service douse dthe fire. 54
